

Herbert Protocol is an information gathering tool to assist the police to find a person living with dementia who has gone missing, as quickly as possible.

If you are concerned about a person living with dementia and believe they are missing, this is an emergency and you MUST dial 999.

This form is designed to be completed by a family member/friend/neighbour with copies of the form being held by all relevant people. It is a good idea to fill this form in after diagnosis so you are prepared. Keep it as up-to-date as possible.

Following completion of this form, relatives and carers can request an NFC enabled (Near-field Communication) assistance Wristband or Hangtag for their family members. The devices, programmed by South Yorkshire Police, store information about the wearer including their name and an emergency contact number which can be retrieved by emergency services, health professionals via a mobile phone to help return the wearer to safety if they are found lost or in need of assistance.
